- Making a life income gift agreement such as a charitable remainder trust, charitable lead trust or charitable gift annuity.
- Making the Community Foundation the owner of a paid-up life insurance policy or the beneficiary of a life insurance policy.

The Centennial Society recognizes all gifts that, in effect, continue a donor's support of the Community Foundation after his or her lifetime. There is no minimum gift requirement for membership in the Centennial Society. Many estate provisions are expressed as a percentage or remainder of your estate and thus may vary over time.
